

1. Suspension - One Year
2. Effective July 22, 2015

Respondent was in default for his failure to file an answer to the formal complaint but he did appear at the hearing. Based on respondent's default and the exhibits presented, the hearing panel found that respondent assisted his client in conduct he knew to be fraudulent, in violation of MRPC 1.2(c); knowingly made a false statement of material fact to a tribunal or failed to correct a false statement of material fact previously made to the tribunal, in violation of MRPC 3.3(a)(1); offered evidence he knew to be false, in violation of MRPC 3.3(a)(3); failed to take reasonable remedial measures, including, if necessary, disclosure to the tribunal when the lawyer knows that his client intends to engage, is engaging, or has engaged in criminal or fraudulent conduct related to the adjudicative proceeding involving the client, in violation of MRPC 3.3(b); and failed to inform the tribunal, in an ex parte proceeding, of all material facts that are known to the lawyer that will enable the tribunal to make an informed decision, whether or not the facts are adverse, in violation of MRPC 3.3(d). The hearing panel also found violations of MCR 9.104(1)-(4); and MRPC 8.4(a) and (c).

The panel ordered that respondent's license to practice law in Michigan be suspended for one year. Costs were assessed in the amount of \$2,220.37.
