1. Disbarment
2. Effective May 1, 2010¹

Respondent appeared at the hearing but was found to be in default for failing to file an answer to the formal complaint. Based on respondent's default, the hearing panel found that respondent practiced law while disbarred, in violation of MCR 9.119(E)(1); held himself out as an attorney while disbarred from the practice of law, in violation of MCR 9.119(E)(4); engaged in conduct contrary to justice, ethics, honesty, or good morals, in violation MCR 9104(3); violated an order of discipline, in violation of MCR 9.104(9); engaged in conduct that is a violation of the Michigan Rules of Professional Conduct, contrary to MRPC 8.4(a) and MCR 9.104(4); and engaged in conduct involving dishonesty, fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, or violation of the criminal law, where such conduct reflects adversely on the lawyer's honesty, trustworthiness, or fitness as a lawyer, in violation of MRPC 8.4(b).

The panel ordered that respondent be disbarred, retroactive May 1, 2010. Respondent filed a delayed petition for review which was granted. Upon review, the Attorney Discipline Board affirmed the hearing panel's order of disbarment. Total costs were assessed in the amount of \$2,263.19.
