

The Respondent failed to answer three of the four complaints consolidated for hearing and failed to appear at the scheduled hearing. The panel concluded that the allegations of misconduct were established by the evidence or admitted by default. Respondent was retained by a client to institute collection proceedings against four debtors, but he failed to take action on his client's behalf and failed to communicate with his client. Respondent subsequently made false statements to the client and to the Grievance Administrator regarding the nature of his retention in those The panel found that Respondent's client obtained a judgment against him but that he failed to comply with various post judgment orders, gave false information at a debtor's examination and violated the The panel also found that the provisions of an order of contempt. Respondent gave false answers to a Request for Investigation filed by another client and failed to answer two Formal Complaints. Respondent's conduct was found to be in violation of MCR 9.104(1-4,6); MCR 9.113(A); and Canons 1, 6 and 7 of the Code of Professional Responsibility. DR 1-102(A)(1,4-6); DR 6-103(A)(3) and DR 7-101(A)(1-3). Costs were assessed in the amount of \$559.82.

In its report on discipline, the panel cited the nature of the misconduct, Respondent's apparent contempt for the disciplinary process and his record of prior discipline consisting of a thirty-day suspension effective October 1, 1987 and a one-year suspension effective December 16, 1987.
